Wayfinder is differentiated to fit the content and needs of each grade level:

Kindergarten	One integrated chart based on the four Kindergarten frames – sample
Grades 1-6	One chart per grade built around SMH-ON's HPE lessons - sample
Grades 7-8	One chart per grade built around the MH 7/8 Ministry of Education modules - sample
Grade 9-12	One integrated chart that demonstrates a progression of MH learning with a focus on student agency, leadership, and participation - <u>sample</u>
